

Stained glass space catcher:

Materials Needed:

- Pipettes
- Stained glass paint set
- Clear plastic plates

Instructions:

- Drip different colors of paint on the plate
- Pick up the plate and slowly turn it, allowing the paints to mix
- Use a brush to help spread the paint if needed and fill in the blank remaining spaces
- Let the paint dry overnight
- Sprinkle white acrylic paint (slightly watered down for ease) with a brush
- Cut into desired shapes



Constellations in a jar:

Materials Needed:

- Mason jar/glass container
- Click puck light (cooler toned light)
- Silver sharpie

Instructions:

- Cut a strip of aluminum or tin long enough to fit the inside of the glass container
- Use a silver sharpie to draw desired constellations
- Poke holes using a pen or an awl at the major points in the constellations
- Poke smaller holes throughout the sheet
- Roll the aluminum to fit the inside of the glass container as snug as possible and tape the edges together
- Place a bright light in the center of the jar, within the aluminum
- Decorate the jar lid as desired



Galaxy Candle Jar:

Materials Needed:

- Mason jar/glass container
- Decoupage glue
- Gel food coloring
- Glitter
- Stirring sticks
- Disposable plastic cup
- Battery-operated tea light

Instructions:

- Mix 2 tablespoons of decoupage, 2-3 drops of water, glitter, and food coloring to desired shade. Create 3-4 different colors.
- Spot coat the inside of the mason jar with the mixture. Distribute the colors uniformly by carefully turning the jar until the mason jar's interior is fully covered.
- Drain the excess mixture from the jar by placing upside down on a cooling rack for about 5 minutes.
- Bake for 15-20 minutes or until the decoupage is clear.
- Place a battery operated teal light in the jar

Note:

- Do not use real candles as the heat will melt the decoupage
- An alternative for a cooling rack could be any container (such as tupperware) with popsicle sticks propped on top in a cross formation
- Does not have to be a mason jar, any glass container that is oven safe. Do not use any plastic container.
