



UCSD opened its doors in the fall of 1960!!




YORK was a physicist and held many important research and administrative positions. He worked closely with students on numerous research projects.


UC San Diego's 1st chancellor was a man by the name of Herbert York. Today he is considered a visionary founder for his major contributions to the early years of UC San Diego.







JOHN MUIR




The next college is John Muir college founded in 1967. Named after the environmentalist John Muir.







THURGOOD MARSHALL COLLEGE






Sixth college is the newest college, founded in 2001. The focus of the college is to teach students to become innovative, aware and engaged through the college's academic and co-curricular programs.







Theodor Geisel, better known as Dr. Seuss, is a major part of UC San Diego. He created some very famous characters such as the Cat in the Hat.






Check this out, it's the snake path that leads to Geisel library. Pretty cool work of art right??







The students at UC San Diego have always been very involved with activism, which is the idea of coming together and fighting for a cause they all believe in such as the cost of education.




Here at UCSD, there are many clubs for students to be involved in. These organizations can be for fun or community service.






Price Center, has many different places for students to eat. It is also where many organizations hold their weekly meetings. Price Center is a very popular place to be.







