

Choosing Upper-Division Non-Contiguous Courses

Two four-unit, upper-division courses (numbered 100+), non-contiguous (unrelated to the major discipline, are required. Courses must be taken at UC San Diego, Education Abroad Program, or another UC campus. Courses may be from the same discipline or same department.
